Thoughts on Altars

Collins' English Dictionary - 'A raised place or structure where sacrifices are offered and religious rites performed'.

That definition is unlikely to be the one you had in mind - perhaps:

- A place of focus for your belief
- Somewhere to stand sacred candles, bowls, incense, flowers etc.
- A source of inspiration
- Somewhere to display special artefacts
- Somewhere to find solace

Throughout history, almost every belief system has utilised an altar in some way. It has usually occupied a 'special place' either indoors or out such as a sacred grove, a religious building or a shrine. In addition to public locations many people have an altar in their home - it may be a single object (cross, god/goddess, chalice) or something more complex.

People often say to us that they don't have anywhere to put an altar and others agonise about what they should put on one. Like all things in life - keep it simple - the purpose is more important than the physical appearance and if there is nowhere for a permanent one, why not a portable one. The only sacrifice should be your time!
