2010. The changes will include fixed 'units', new 'casual' tables/spaces and considerable redecoration and enhanced entrances. It is also planned that the market will be open 6 days a week. As Welshpool Council has the money it is pretty sure to happen and more details are to be published very soon.

Newtown Market Hall is owned by Powys County Council and they want to relinquish responsibility for it. Mid Wales Food and Land Trust wish to take it on and have followed up a survey of the building with the publication of

plans currently exhibited in the Market Hall. Discussions have taken place with traders regarding the plans and Powys County Council support the proposal. However at present the stumbling block is, as ever, money. Funding is currently being sought to repair and refurbish the building. We are unlikely to see any changes for at least a year!

Montgomery Town Hall, home of Mystic Alley as well as weekly markets, is also owned by Powys. The plan is to pass it to Montgomery Town Council who in turn will pass the running of it to a newly set up Trust. Plans have been produced for improvements to the facilities including a lift, and consultation has taken place with users of the Hall. Again the major hurdle is money and bids are being prepared. Developments are unlikely until Spring/Summer 2010.

Naturally, TSC is contributing to the ongoing discussions and watching developments as we would want to maintain and maybe develop our activity in all three locations. Hopefully, as and when work begins, disruption including temporary closures will be minimal.

Let us all hope that it is not too long before users of the halls can enjoy much improved facilities.
